Study Goal: Improve staff COVID-19 vaccination response at long-term care centers.

Why is this study important?

While the COVID-19 vaccine is highly effective in preventing illness and limiting spread of the virus, some workers at long-term care centers (LTCCs) may have concerns about getting the vaccine for themselves and encouraging others to get it too. The ENSPIRE project will work with staff at LTCCs to understand what kinds of communications help increase vaccine confidence and booster uptake.

What is this study about?

This is a cluster randomized trial that will test 3 ways to increase COVID-19 vaccine confidence and booster uptake in LTCC workers. LTCCs who agree to take part will be placed into one of 3 study groups:

- Group 1 will receive CDC information materials about COVID-19 vaccinations.
- Group 2 will take part in a co-design process
 with LTCC workers at other centers to develop
 information materials to promote COVID-19
 vaccines. These selected LTCC workers will also
 be trained as peer advocates to support staff
 COVID-19 vaccinations.
- Group 3 will receive the information materials created by Group 2 to help promote staff COVID-19 vaccinations.

LTCCs will not know which group they will be in until after they agree to be in the study and complete the first center and staff surveys. Each LTCC will receive yearly "impact payments" for 2 years to help with time and resources needed to complete study activities (Groups 1 & 3: \$1000, Group 2: \$5000).

Who will be involved?

Our goal is to recruit a total of 60 LTCCs in Georgia

and Washington State. LTCCs must have at least 50 individuals on staff.

What does the study involve?

We will ask LTCCs in the study to:

- Sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) agreeing to be in the study.
- Tell us about their center by completing surveys and interviews at the beginning and end of the study. Provide total staff booster vaccination rates at 4 to 5 time points.
- Help study team recruit staff to do surveys at 3 time points and a 1-time focus group.
- Distribute flyers, emails, texts, social media posts, etc., to staff about the importance of COVID-19 vaccination and the value of booster vaccines.
- Help identify and support 4 staff to take part in codesigning culturally diverse materials (for LTCCs in Group 2 only). Provide scheduling flexibility for these staff (up to 30 hours over 10 weeks).

What are the next steps?
